And they must be serving as local leaders in their club or county wide.

Let's Plan a Successful 4-H Year Together

Get started by finding a folder or maybe a box. Decorate and use it for your 4-H project pieces. This is a great way to keep all your 4-H materials, including ribbons, reports, papers, photos, etc., together.

Visit <u>https://4h.tennessee.edu/what-interests-you/</u>, then follow these five simple steps.

<u>Step 1:</u> Find and click on your 4-H project. Open the project sheet and determine the skills you wish to learn/gain.

<u>Step 2:</u> Create your plan - click to open Project Plan. Complete this after choosing 3-5 goals you wish to accomplish. List resources available to you and also things that you do not have, but may need.

<u>Step 3:</u> Next, click on the project ideas button and determine service ideas you can do.

<u>Step 4:</u> Now, get started by focusing on the skills you chose. Work on your plan, plus complete the activity sheet and other project materials you have.

<u>Step 5:</u> When you have completed the activity sheet, fill out the "Looking Back" portion of the project plan. Then turn in your 4-H project folder to your agent or leader for evaluation.
