If you are chosen as a delegate for this conference, you will be involved in educational programming on the campus of the University of Tennessee in Knoxville (UTK). Delegates will receive extensive, hands-on training in project areas, under the supervision of university scientists and specialists on the UTK campus. The conference will provide a variety of rewarding and fun-filled experiences inside the classroom, outdoors, and in laboratory settings.

#### **Housing and Meals**

Central and Western Region 4-H members will be bused to Knoxville, while Eastern Region 4-H members should plan to be transported by parents or 4-H agent. Once youth have arrived on campus, they will be housed in air-conditioned comfort of the UT Knoxville residence halls—just like real college students! Most of the meals will be on campus: the University Cafeteria, break-fasts sponsored by UT Collegiate 4-H/FFA Club, lunch sponsored by Knox County 4-H Honor Club, and a Pizza Party. The Graduation Banquet is a fancy shin-dig so pull out fancy outfit (not really — just bring a nice suit or dress).

#### Cost to Attend

The registration fee to attend Academic Conference is \$100 per delegate. Because our sponsors think this conference is important to attend, each delegate is only paying a portion of the total fee. Once delegates are notified of their selection, they will be instructed to pay the \$100 fee to the County Extension Office.

#### What You Should Bring

- Sheets, blanket, pillow and/or sleeping bag for a twin bed
- Towels and washcloth
- Soap, shampoo, toothbrush, toothpaste, deodorant, other toiletries
- Comfortable walking shoes(2 pairs)
- Raincoat or umbrella, Light jacket or hoodie for cool weather
- Appropriate clothing (sports clothes in good taste will be appropriate for most of the conference. No cutoffs, tank tops, inappropriate words/images on attire or short shorts)
- Girls a "dressy" dress or suit will be appropriate for the graduation banquet
- Boys a suit or sport coat with tie will be appropriate for the graduation banquet
- Alarm clock/Watch or time piece
- Bathing suit (This should be appropriate)
- Closed-toed shoes (For all participants in animal projects)
- Jeans and old shoes that can get dirty (Specifically for the Forestry/Wildlife/Fisheries project)
- Consider bringing some work-type clothing for 4-H Project Classes (Many will be involved in handson learning experiences with plants and animals)
- Spending money and money for lunch on the way to Knoxville and breakfast on the way home
- Water Bottle
- Prescription medications (*Must be in the original bottle*) & <u>F-600 Health Form</u> should be turned in to the county 4-H agent prior to the conference (*with photograph*)

#### The Characteristics of an Exemplary Delegate

As an official delegate representing your region, delegates should be on their best behavior and act as a model 4-H'er. Here are a few things to ensure success during this conference:

- Make it a point to be on time or ahead of time for each session or event
- Be a good listener. Impress the scientists or specialists with delegates' ability to pay attention
- Tobacco products, drugs, weapons, and chewing gum are not permitted at this conference
- Writing notes of thanks to sponsors, leaders, agents, and parents is greatly appreciated
- Share experiences with others when delegates return home. Take notes and be prepared to give an interesting and worthwhile account of the experience on the UTK campus

#### How Can I Apply for This Conference?

Applicants will need to fill out the Application for Academic Conference and a <u>Section A</u> form for the portfolio for all project areas except Citizenship. If you are applying to attend Academic Conference in the Citizenship project area, you will fill out the application for Academic Conference and a <u>Section C</u> form. <u>Both forms (your application and Section A or C) should be sent to your 4–</u> <u>H Agent by March 25</u>.

Upon acceptance, delegates will be notified by your 4-H agent. This typically occurs by the end of each April.
