4-H Achievement Night

Plan to meet and deliver your demonstrations or interactive exhibits for our annual Achievement event in April. We are hosting it at our Extension complex at 1219 McArthur Rd on <u>Tuesday, April 8 5-6:30 p.m</u>. If you present a video at the local contest, you may present the same or a different one at the county contest. There will be a Table Top Exhibit division for middle school members. We also have plans for both a baking and photography contest opened to any 4-H member. Read and follow the guidelines for sub-missions.

Photographers - Shoot Away & Show Us Your Stuff

Select up to 5 photos that you have taken in the past year. Put your digital photos into a PowerPoint file and label each slide with the requested information below before submitting.

RULES:

- 1. Each 4-H member may enter 1 photo per category up to 5 photos in the county contest.
- 2. The categories are: People; Buildings; Landscapes; Animals and/or Trick.
- 3. Either black and white or color photos may be entered but no more than 5 in total.
- 4. All photos must have been taken by the 4-H member in the 24-25 school year.
- 5. All pictures must be submitted digitally with a title/caption.
- 6. The 4-H member should add a slide for their name, school/club and grade to identify their exhibit.
- 7. Send bundled files to james@utk.edu by April 4.

Bakers – Fire Up Your Ovens & Cook

You may submit one entry per category. Categories are <u>Loaf Breads</u>, <u>Pies</u>, <u>Cakes/</u> <u>Muffins</u>, <u>Cornbread</u>, <u>Biscuits</u>, <u>Brownies/Cookies</u>. No "No Bake Items" allowed. **Entry procedure:**

Muffins, biscuits, brownies, and cookies- bring three on a paper plate in a plastic bag. Cakes, loaf breads and pan breads, bring the whole item. (<u>Do Not Cut Them</u>). Bring your <u>RECIPE</u> and it must show that you used/mixed 3 or more ingredients.

4-H Clover Bowl Championships

The 4-H Clover Bowl Championships will be conducted using a single elimination contest to select county champion teams in grades 4-8. There will be a seeding round test used and each local team participating at the county level will test to determine their seed. The final four teams will vie for top placings.

Club teachers may put together a team or allow members to form teams. Name your team and submit it to the 4-H Office by **April 11** by email to Amy Berger at <u>aberger2@utk.edu</u> or to James McMillion at <u>james@utk.edu</u>. You will receive an email after your team information is confirmed and a test will be sent to each team member to be completed within a 7 day period. Based on questions answered correctly and or missed questions, your team will receive a seed ranking. Top seeded teams play bottom seeded teams and middles play each other. The county Clover Bowl contest date is slated for **April 22** 5p.m. at the Blount County 4-H office.
