1. Travel Clothes

Purpose: Comfort for long rides/flights.

Guidelines: School-appropriate, comfortable, layered. No pajamas or offensive graphics.

Examples: Leggings/joggers with hoodie, athletic pants and t-shirt, jeans with sweatshirt and sneakers.

3. Swimsuit

Purpose: For pool or beach time.

Guidelines: Secure fit. No thongs.

Examples: One-piece or two-piece.

*****No clothing with inappropriate language/images.*****

2. Dressy Casual

Purpose: Group dinners or special activities.

Guidelines: Neat and modest. No ripped clothes, short skirts, crop tops, or flip-flops.

Examples: Blouse with jeans, casual dress with flats.

4. Cover-Up

Purpose: Worn over swimwear outside swim areas.

Guidelines: Must fully cover swimsuit when not swimming.

Examples: T-shirt and shorts, sundress, long tee, gym clothes, or lightweight cover-up.

Each active All Star member is eligible to enter a project exhibit in the All Star exhibit competition. Exhibits must be set up between 1:00-6:30 p.m. on Monday. Exhibits may be taken down Thursday afternoon.

Purpose

The purpose of the project exhibit is to provide 4-H All Stars an additional opportunity to share ideas accomplishments, requirements and/or results of special studies or research in their 4-H project.

Rules

1. Any active 4-H All Star who attends the State 4-H All Star Conference may enter one exhibit in the competition.
2. Exhibits must be displayed on a 3' x 3' tabletop. The area from the table top to the floor may also be utilized.
3. Members are encouraged to make their exhibits "free standing," since it may not be possible for each table to be against the wall.
4. Exhibits will be scored according to the 4-H Educational Display score sheet.

Awards

A first place plaque will be awarded to the All Star with the highest scoring exhibit. The top five exhibitors will receive a \$25 award. All exhibits will be classified into blue and red award groups.
